EDUCATIONAL VISITS

Conservation & Biodiversity (key stages 1 and 2)

Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park is the largest newest urban park built in the UK for over a century and represents a relatively new movement in landscape design: "green infrastructure". As part of this educational visit, students can explore the parklands by completing a Biodiversity Treasure trail, discover wetland habitats and ponds through a supervised pond dipping session and take part in seasonal conservation activities.

Duration: 1.5 hours

Cost: Free visits available for local schools (Newham, Tower Hamlets, Hackney, Waltham Forest, Greenwich and Barking and Dagenham) or £270 for a class up to 30 students for non-local schools

Energy & Sustainability (key stage 3)

Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park is home to the largest decentralised energy scheme to be built in the UK and makes a key contribution to the Park meeting its zero carbon ambitions. Sustainability and the environment were at the heart of London's successful bid for the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games and today the Park respects these promises, creating a sustainable development in tune with the world's changing climate and resource needs. As part of this education visit, students will be guided through the Park to learn more about the sustainable developments before heading to the Energy Centre's exhibition area to get a better understanding of the site's energy production.

Duration: 1.5 hours

Cost: Free visits available for local schools (Newham, Tower Hamlets, Hackney, Waltham Forest, Greenwich and Barking and Dagenham) or £270 for a class up to 30 students for non-local schools
